

## Image of the Month

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**A** 57-YEAR-OLD MAN PRESENTED WITH ANTERIOR chest wall swelling 4 months after a video-assisted thoracic surgery wedge resection of a 2.5-cm benign mass in the right upper lobe. The swelling was associated with mild chest discomfort that worsened with coughing. Physical examination revealed soft, non-

tender swelling that was well demarcated on the right anterior chest wall in the anterior axillary line and was associated with a cough impulse (**Figure 1**).

### What Is the Diagnosis?

- A. Chest wall lipoma
- B. Pectoralis major tendon rupture
- C. Intercostal lung hernia
- D. Delayed seroma
