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A 60-YEAR-OLD MAN WAS REFERRED FOR CLOSURE of an 18-month, recurrent, nonhealing ulcer in the anterior medial aspect of his left leg over a burn scar from a gasoline fire experienced when the patient was 5 years of age. He said that the ulcer commenced after an abrasion in a motorcycle accident 18 months before.

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On examination, the lesion measured 10 × 5 cm, the borders were erythematous, and the wound was foul smelling and painful (**Figure**).

What Is the Diagnosis?

- A. Venous stasis ulcer.
- B. Pyoderma gangrenosum.
- C. Foreign body abscess.
- D. Marjolin ulcer.
